Description for Haworthia attenuata

Plant height: 2 - 5 inches (5 - 13 cm)

Plant spread: 2 - 4 inches (5 - 11 cm)

The largest member of the genus Haworthia, *Haworthia Margaritifera* looks like an aloe due to its relatively large rosettes of spotted, pointed leaves. It grows from a fleshy, fibrous root system and slowly creates a cluster of plants in a pointy, mounded clump. The plump, long, pointed leaves that emerge from the centre of the rosette are rigid and succulent. Each leaf is bright to olive-green, while on the outer side of the leaves, hundreds of greenish-white bumps (tubercles) decorate the surface, making them look ornately spotted.

Common name(s): Pearl plant, *Haworthia minor*

Flower colours: Greenish to brownish-white

Bloom time: Late winter to summer

Max reachable height: Up to 20 cm

Difficulty to grow: Easy to grow

Planting and care

Initial care for 1-2 weeks after receiving plant at your location:

Check the moisture in the soil before watering it.
Poke your finger into the soil, if dry then apply water.
Keep the plant in indirect bright light.
Do not re-pot immediately after receiving it.

Key requirements to keep plant healthy:

Sunlight: Bright indirect light.

Soil: Well drained soil

Water: Low for the rainy season, Moderate for winter, More than moderate for a summer

Temperature: Ideal: 22 to 35 degrees Celsius.

Fertilizer: Apply organic fertilizer

Caring for Haworthia attenuata

Sunlight

- Keep the plant in a place that receives bright indirect sunlight.
- **Shield** the Haworthia plant from harsh sunlight as it can cause damage to the foliage.
- **Watering** should be well drained and fertile for growing Haworthia plant.
- Water the plant when the topsoil (1-2 inch) in pot feels dry to touch.
- Do not overwater the plant.
- Do not pour water on the leaves of plant.
- **Application of Fertilizer** summer and reduce watering in winter and rainy season.
- During the main growing season (April - August) feed the Haworthia plant with organic fertilizer once a month.
- **Re-potting** topsoil without disturbing the roots of the plant so it can uptake the nutrients and moisture easily.
- When a plant outgrows in current pot, re-pot with fresh potting soil and some fertilizer.
- Do the re-potting late evening and keep the plant in shady area for 2 to 3 days and then move the plant in its suitable climatic condition.

Plant Protection

- Remove dead, infected or damaged plant parts and discard them away from the plants.
- For any insect attack or disease, you can use Neem oil, Eucalyptus oil or Citrus oil spray for primary treatment.

Ornamental use: Best for small pots and for rock gardens.
