Description for Aglaonema widuri, Aglaonema Red Peacock

Plant height: 5 - 9 inches (12 - 23 cm)

Plant spread: 4 - 8 inches (10 - 21 cm)

Aglaonema is a genus of flowering plants in the arum family Araceae. They are native to tropical and subtropical regions of Asia and New Guinea. They are known commonly as Chinese evergreen. This aglaonema is a low maintenance plant. Aglaonema commutatum Malay air purifier and good luck bringer indoor plant.

Common name(s): Aglaonema Red Peacock

Flower colours: Greenish-white spathe

Bloom time: Seasonal bloom

Max reachable height: up to 1.21 meter

Difficulty to grow: Easy to grow

Planting and care

Initial (1 -2 weeks) care once the plant reaches your place:

- Check the moisture in the soil before watering it.
- Poke your finger into the soil, if dry then apply water.
- Keep the plant in indirect light.
- Do not re-pot immediately after receiving it.

Key requirements to keep plant healthy:

Sunlight: bright indirect natural light or bright artificial light.

Soil: soil should be well-drained and fertile.

Water: Medium

Temperature: 16 to 30 degree C

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer.

Caring for Aglaonema widuri

Sunlight

- Keep the plant indoor with bright indirect natural light or bright artificial light.
- **Shade** the plant from direct sunlight as it can cause damage to the foliage.
- **Watering** should be well drained and fertile for growing aglaonema plant.
- Water the plant when the topsoil (1-2 inch) in pot feels dry to touch.
- Do not overwater the plant.
- **Application of Fertilizer** summer and reduce watering in winter and rainy season but do not let the plant dry out completely.
- During the main growing season feed the plant with organic fertilizer once a month.
- **Re-potting** topsoil without disturbing the roots of the plant so it can uptake the nutrients and moisture easily.
- When a plant outgrows in current pot, re-pot with fresh potting soil and some fertilizer.
- Do the re-potting late evening and keep the plant in shady area for 2 to 3 days and then move the plant in its suitable climatic condition.

Plant Protection

- Remove dead, infected or damaged plant parts and discard them away from the plants.
 - For any insect attack or disease, you can use Neem oil, Eucalyptus oil or Citrus oil spray for primary treatment.
- Don'ts**
- Do not place your plant in bright direct sunlight it can burn the leaves of plant.
 - keep away from the AC Vents.
 - Do not overwater the plant especially when pot does not have drainage holes.

Typical uses of Aglaonema widuri

Special features: glossy crime-green dot on leaves with red edges.

Ornamental use: It is used as the ornamental plant.
