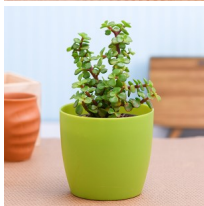


Elephant bush, Portulacaria afra, Jade plant (Green) - Succulent Plant

Botanical name of Elephant bush is Portulacaria afra. Elephant bush is a small-leaved succulent plant found in South Africa. These succulents commonly have a reddish stem and leaves that are green Elephant Bush small-leaved succulent plant found in South Africa. Elephant Bush commonly has a reddish stem and green leaves. The vibrant green leaves are symbolic of growth and renewal. Jade

plants have long been thought to bring good fortune to their owners.

Planting and care

Initial care for 1-2 weeks after receiving plant at your location:

- Keep the plant in Natural indirect /Artificial bright Light.
- Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture.
- apply 1 cup (Approx. 50 ml) water when top soil (3-4 inches) feels dry to touch.
- Do not re-pot for min. 2 weeks after receiving it.

Key requirements to keep plant healthy:

Sunlight: Natural indirect/artificial bright light.

Soil: Soil should be well drain and porous.

Water: Apply 1 cup (Approx. 50 ml) water when the topsoil (3-4 inch) in pot feels dry to touch.

Temperature: 18-24 degree Celsius.

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer once a month.

Caring for Elephant bush

Sunlight

- Natural indirect / artificial bright light is ideal for jade plant growth.

◦ **Watering** should be well drained and porous.

- Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture.

◦ Apply 1 cup (Approx. 50 ml) of water when the top soil (3-4 inch) in pot feels dry to touch.

◦ Apply water probably in the morning or evening time.

◦ Do not overwater the plant.

◦ **Application of Fertilizer** the plant thoroughly in the summer and reduce watering in winter and rainy season.

◦ Before application of fertilizer loosen the topsoil without disturbing the roots of the plant so it can uptake the nutrients and moisture.

◦ During the main growing season (January-March) feed the plant with organic fertilizer once a month.

◦ **Rainy Protection** immediately after application of fertilizer.

◦ Remove dead, infected or damaged plant parts and discard them away from the plants.

◦ For any insect attack or disease, you can use Neem oil, Eucalyptus oil or Citrus oil spray for primary treatment.

Don'ts

◦ Do not over water the plant especially when pot does not have drainage holes.

◦ keep away from the AC Vents.

◦ Do not apply water on plant leaves.

Special features: Consider as Good luck plant.

Ornamental use:

- It makes an excellent container or house plant.
