Description Ostrya virginiana, is a species of Ostrya native to eastern North America, from Nova Scotia west to southern Manitoba and eastern Wyoming, southeast to northern Florida and southwest to eastern Texas.

Planting & Care

Easily grown in average, medium, well-drained soil in full sun to part shade.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: temperature is 13° C (56° F).

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Leaves turn an undistinguished yellow in autumn and often drop early.
- Flowers are monoecious (reddish-brown male flowers and greenish female flowers appear in separate catkins on the same tree).
- good watering.

Special Feature:

Lawn tree, street tree or woodland garden.

Use

Medicinal use:

- The Hornbeam, however, is heavily used by beaver because it is common their habitat.
- It is also the larval host of several butterflies including the Eastern Tiger Swallowtail, Striped hairstreak, Red-spotted Purple, and Tiger Swallow-tail.

Ornamental use:

- This tree is used in landscaping, particularly along boulevards.
- Its appeal is that it retains its coppery-tan leaves well into or through winter
