Description for Asparagus Meyer

Plant height: 5 - 9 inches (12 - 23 cm)

Plant spread: 4 - 6 inches (10 - 16 cm)

Asparagus aethiopicus is native to southern regions of South Africa. Growing asparagus fern is easy. Asparagus belongs to Asparagaceae family. The frilly, feathery asparagus fern plant appears soft and fuzzy. Asparagus aethiopicus, Sprenger's asparagus, is a plant native to the Cape Provinces and the Northern Provinces of South Africa. Often used as an ornamental plant, it is considered an invasive weed in many locations.

Common name(s): Asparagus meyeri, Foxtail Ferns, Bunny Tails, Asparagus fern.

Flower colours: White.

Bloom time: Seasonal bloomer

Max reachable height: Up to 60centimeters.

Difficulty to grow: Easy to grow.

Planting and care

Initial care for 1-2 weeks after receiving plant at your location:

- Keep the plant in natural indirect bright Light.
- Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture.
- Water when top soil (1-2 inches) feels dry to touch.
- Do not re-pot for min. 2 weeks after receiving it.

Key requirements to keep plant healthy:

Sunlight: Natural bright light.

Soil: Soil should be well drain and fertile, rich in organic content.

Water: Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture. Water when top soil (1-2 inches) feels dry to touch. Water thoroughly in the summer and reduce watering in winter and rainy season.

Temperature: 20 to 30-degree celsius.

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer.

Caring for Asparagus Meyer

Sunlight

- Keep the plant outdoor in natural bright light.
- **Soil**lect the plant from direct harsh sunlight as it can cause damage to the foliage.
- **Watering** should be well drained and fertile rich in oragnic content.
- Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture.
- Water when top soil (1-2 inches) feels dry to touch.
- **Application of Fertilizer** summer and reduce watering in winter and rainy season.
- During the main growing season feed the plant with organic fertilizer once a month.
- **Repotting** topsoil without disturbing the roots of the plant so it can uptake the nutrients and moisture easily.
- When a plant outgrows in current pot, re-pot with fresh potting soil and some fertilizer.

- Do the re-potting late evening and keep the plant in shady area for 2 to 3 days and then move the plant in its suitable climatic conditions.

Plant Protection

- Remove dead, infected or damaged plant parts and dispose them away from the planting area.
 - Spray Neem, Eucalyptus or Citrus oil for any insect/pest attack, as a primary treatment.
- Don'ts**
- Do not over-water the plant especially when pot does not have drainage holes.

Special features: Attractive foliage.

Ornamental use: It is used as an ornamental plant.
