### Description for Vinca (Lavender)

**Plant height:** 5 - 9 inches (12 - 23 cm)

**Plant spread:** 4 - 6 inches (10 - 16 cm)

Vinca is a genus of flowering plants in the family Apocynaceae. Vinca is an evergreen plant with flowering throughout the year in the tropical and Subtropical region.

The plants are grown for their attractive glossy, green foliage, as well as its flowers. Vinca is commonly used for boundaries or as a hedging plant, and to cover ground.

**Common name(s):** Vinca, Madagascar periwinkle, Myrtle, Nitya Pushpa, Sadabahar.

**Flower colours:** Lavender.

**Bloom time:** Year-round.

**Max reachable height:** up to 120 cm.

**Difficulty to grow:** Easy to grow.

### Planting and care

**Initial care for 1-2 weeks after receiving plant at your location:**

- Keep the plant in Natural indirect bright light.

- Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture.
- Water when top soil (1-2 inches) feels dry to touch.
- Do not re-pot for min. 2 weeks after receiving it.

**Key requirements to keep plant healthy:**

**Sunlight:** Natural bright light.

**Soil:** Soil should be well drain and fertile, rich in organic content.

**Water:** Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture. Water when topsoil (1-2 inches) feels dry to touch. Water thoroughly in the summer and reduce watering in winter and rainy season.

**Temperature:** 22 to 35 degrees Celcius.

**Fertilizer:** Apply any organic fertilizer.

## Caring for Vinca

### Sunlight

- ~~Soil~~ the plant outdoor in natural bright light.
- ~~Watering~~ should be well drained and fertile rich in oragnic content.
- Poke your finger/plain small stick into the soil to check the moisture.
- Water when top soil (1-2 inches) feels dry to touch.
- ~~Application of Fertilizer~~ summer and reduce watering in winter and rainy season.
- During the main growing season feed the Vinca plant with organic fertilizer once a month.
- ~~Re-potting~~ topsoil without disturbing the roots of the plant so it can uptake the nutrients and moisture easily.
- When a plant outgrows in current pot, re-pot with fresh potting soil and some fertilizer.
- Do the re-potting late evening and keep the plant in shady area for 2 to 3 days and then move the plant in its suitable climatic ~~and re-potting procedure~~ [click here](#)

### Plant Protection

- Remove dead, infected or damaged plant parts and dispose them away from the planting area.
- Spray Neem, Eucalyptus or Citrus oil for any insect/pest attack, as a primary treatment.

### Don'ts

- Do not over-water the plant especially when pot does not have drainage holes.

## Typical uses of Vinca

### Special features:

**Ornamental use:** Vinca is commonly used for boundaries or as a hedging plant and to cover the ground.

**Medicinal use:** Lowering blood pressure, treatment for coughs, colds, sore throat, treating eye and lung infections. Note: The following information is general guidelines, Be sure to ask your healthcare provider for guidelines.
