Description for Staff Tree

Plant height: 3 - 6 inches (7 - 16 cm)

Plant spread:

Black Oil Plant is an unarmed large woody climber. Alternately arranged leaves are very variable - elliptic, ovate, broadly, obovate or circular. Base is wedge-shaped, obtuse or rounded, tip is acute, acuminate or obtuse. Flowers are borne in large panicles at the end of branches. Male

flowers are minute, pale green. Sepals nearly circular, toothed. Petals are oblong or obovate-oblong, entire. Female flowers having sepals, petals and disk similar to those of male flowers. Capsule round, bright yellow.

Common name(s): black Oil Plant, celastrus, oriental bittersweet, intellect tree, Jyotishmati

Flower colours: green

Bloom time: September or October

Max reachable height: 15 to 35 ft

Difficulty to grow: easy to grow

Planting and care

An accurate soil test will tell you where your pH currently stands. Acidic (sour) soil is counteracted by applying finely ground limestone, and alkaline (sweet) soil is treated with ground sulfur. If you order roses from a mail-order company, order early, in January or February (March at the latest). They are usually shipped in the spring as bare roots when plants are fully dormant, well before they have leafed out.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Caring for Staff Tree

Start with pruning shears for smaller growth. Use loppers, which look like giant, long-handle shears, for growth that is more than half an inch thick. A small pruning saw is handy, as it cuts on both the push and the pull.

Typical uses of Staff Tree

Oil enriches blood and cures abdominal complaints.

Ornamental use: The plant is used for ornamental purpose

Medicinal use: It has been used to strengthen intellect and memory, relax the mind and body.
Celastrus paniculatus is a woody fruit-bearing vine. The fruit of the plant contains seeds used in Ayurveda medicine.
