Description *Anthriscus sylvestris*, known as cow parsley, wild chervil, wild beaked parsley, keck, or Queen Anne's lace, is a herbaceous biennial or short-lived perennial plant in the family Apiaceae, genus *Anthriscus*.

**Common name:** Wild chervil, cow parsley

**Color:** White

**Bloom time:** June to September

**Height:** 1.00 to 3.00 feet

**Difficulty level:** easy to grow

**Planting & Care**

plants prefer a near-neutral pH range of 5.5–7.0. A pH of 6.5 is just about right for most home gardens (slightly acidic to neutral). An accurate soil test will tell you where your pH currently stands. Acidic (sour) soil is counteracted by applying finely ground limestone, and alkaline (sweet) soil is treated with ground sulfur.

**Sunlight:** Part shade

**Soil:** well-drained soil

**Water:** Medium

**Temperature:** 41° F

**Fertilizer:** Apply any organic fertilizer

**Care:**

- Clean away from around the base of the rosebushes any trimmed debris that can harbor disease and insects.
- Late in the season, stop deadheading rugosas so that hips will form on the plants; these can be harvested and dried on screens, away from sunlight, then stored in an airtight container.
