Description Apium graveolens is a BIENNIAL growing to 0.6 m (2ft) by 0.3 m (1ft in). Suitable pH: acid, neutral and basic (alkaline) soils and can grow in saline soils. Wild celery has a long history of medicinal and food use.

Common name: Cutting celery, Leaf celery, Parcel, Smallage, Zwolsche krul, German celery

Bloom time: Seasonal bloomer

Height: 2.00 to 2.50 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Plants can be cut frequently, starting about 4 weeks after planting. It will regrow and remain productive over many months, though eventually will run to seed inspring. Leave a few plants to see in second season. Young seedlings can be transplanted to wherever required.

Sunlight: Full sun

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 10°C / 50°F

Fertilizer: Apply for organic fertilizer

Care:

- As Celery is tender, ensure temperatures are mild enough to plant out - wait until after your last frost date to be on the safe side.
- By our calculations*, you should look at planting out Celery about 21 days before your last frost date

Special Feature:

Full sun or partial shade suit them equally well, and although they are fairly tolerant of drought, don't plant them in very dry places and water when dry.

Use

Medicinal use:

- The use of celery seed in pills for relieving pain was described by Aulus Cornelius Celsus around AD 30.
- [17] Celery seeds contain a compound, 3-n-butylphthalide, that has been demonstrated to lower blood pressure in rats
