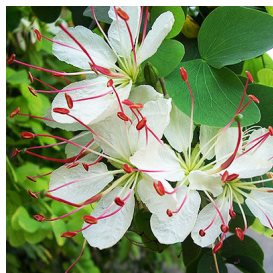

Kachnar is a flowering plant that grows well in parts of Southeast Asia and is native to India, Pakistan, Nepal, Burma and Sri Lanka. It is cultivated as an ornamental tree and famous for its scented flowers. Kachnar is an integral part of cuisine in several Nepali, Pakistani and Indian dishes; it is also valued for its medicinal properties.

Common name: Orchid tree, Mountain ebony, Camel's foot tree, Buddhist Bauhinia

Color: Pink, purple, magenta, lavender, white

Bloom time: Summer, spring, Fall

Height: Height : 25-35 feet

Planting & Care

The trees should be planted especially on the south and south - west sides of the building. This would give shade during summers. Large growing species are particularly desirable at rearwards.

The period of planting depends upon the species, region, availability of irrigation facilities, rainfall of the region, etc. Winter is the best time for planting deciduous trees as they are dormant at this period and hence less likely to suffer from damage. For evergreen and semi-deciduous trees, rainy season is the best time for planting. Trees may be planted during the following periods:

During Spring: That is January and February. At this time all the factors (especially the temperature), required for tree growth are present. Thus, this is a good time for young saplings to be planted.

At the onset of Monsoons: For most species and most areas, planting is carried out during monsoons. It is advisable to start planting work immediately after a good shower and when the ground is well moistened to the depth of planting. Thereafter any delay should be treated as loss of growing season.

Sunlight: full sunlight

Soil: These plants prefer a fertile, moisture-retentive but well-drained soil.

Water: The tree is fairly resistant to drought and do not require much watering.

Temperature: Mean maximum temperature in the range 30 – 42°C and a mean minimum temperature in the range 7 – 14°C. Plants can experience occasional temperatures down to -2°C in their native range.

Use

Medicinal use:

- Traditionally, the stem bark of Kachnar has been used in Ayurveda to treat diabetes, ulcers and asthma.
- It has also been used as an anti-inflammatory, hepato-protective and anti-tumor agent.
- The roots and buds of the tree are used to improve digestion.
- Recent studies have shown this herb to have valuable hypoglycemic action, supporting this use as an anti-diabetic agent.
- Some studies have also found Kachnar to possess antibacterial activity.

Note:

Side Effects: Kachnar is safe for general use. However, due to its hypoglycemic action, it should be used with care by persons on anti-diabetic medication.
