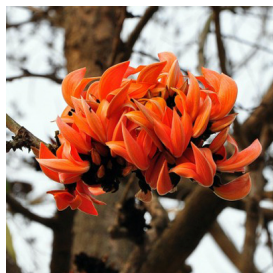


## Butea Monosperma, Palash - 0.5 Kg Seeds

### Description

Butea monosperma is a species of Butea native to tropical and sub-tropical parts of the Indian Subcontinent and Southeast Asia, ranging across India, Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, Thailand.

**Common name:** Butea monosperma

**Color:** Orange/red

**Bloom time:** January to March

**Height:** 30.00 to 40.00 feet

**Difficulty level:** easy to grow

### Planting & Care

After a good rain, find a spot that is the first to dry out. Water trapped beneath the scales may rot the bulb, so a well-drained site is essential. Also, select a site that gets full sun. For dependable blooms, lilies need six to eight hours of direct sunlight a day.

**Sunlight:** Full sun to part shade

**Soil:** well-drained soil

**Water:** Medium

**Temperature:** 30° C

**Fertilizer:** Apply any organic fertilizer

### Care:

- The mulch should feel moist but not wet.
- Apply a high-potassium liquid fertilizer every 2 weeks from early spring until 6 weeks after flowering.
- Keep moist in winter.

- Apply a thin layer of compost each spring, followed by a 2-inch layer of mulch.
- Stake tall lilies.
- Lilies do not rebloom, but you can remove the faded flowers so that the plants seeds.

**Special Feature:**

Best planted as a specimen in a mixed grove of trees that will hide its awkward habit but give its flowers full visibility.

**Ornamental use:**

- The plant is used for ornamental purpose.
- Its generally kep indoor in living room and in terrac area.

**Note:**

No serious insect or disease problems.
