Description Caraway, also known as Persian cumin, (*Carum carvi*) is a biennial plant in the family Apiaceae, native to western Asia, Europe, and North Africa.

Common name: Thymus herba-barona

Color: Pink

Bloom time: June to July

Height: 0.25 to 0.50 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

It is native to Europe and Western Asia where it thrives in full sun and well drained soil with pH ranges of 6.5 to 7.0. It isn't a good plant for hot, humid climates and prefers cool temperate zones.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Dry to medium

Temperature: 30°C

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Sow the seeds 1/2-inch deep in fall or spring.
- Once seed germinates, thin the caraway plant to 8 to 12 inches apart.

Special Feature:

Herb gardens, containers. May be sprawled over small rocks or ledges in rock gardens or over walls. Also effective as a small area ground cover.

Use

Medicinal use:

- Caraway, or *Carum carvi*, is a biennial plant in the family of Apiaceae that is native to Asia.
- Europe and Africa.
- Caraway is popular for fruits (also known as “seeds”) that has pungent anise-like flavor and aroma and is used for culinary preparations with medicinal benefits.
