Planting & Care

Before you plant, be sure that you choose varieties proven in your climate. When in doubt, All-America Rose Selections winners are good bets. Or check with your local nursery. If you order plants from a mail-order company, order early, in January or February (March at the latest).

Sunlight: Full sun

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 12-30 deg. C

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Plants love water but don't drown them.
- That is, they don't like to sit in water, and they die if the soil is too wet in winter.
- The ideal soil is rich and loose, with good drainage.
- One of the worst mistakes you can make is to not provide adequate drainage.
- Use mulch.

Special Feature:

Narrow columnar form is sometimes difficult to fit into residential landscapes. Good specimen around tall buildings.
