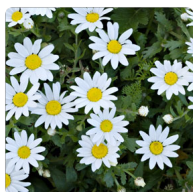

Description Chamaemelum nobile commonly known as chamomile, Roman chamomile, English chamomile, garden chamomile, ground apple, low chamomile, or whig plant, is a low perennial plant found in dry fields and around

Common name: Roman Chamomile

Color: white and yellow

Bloom time: June to September

Height: 0.25 to 0.50 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Roman chamomile is also known as Russian chamomile and English chamomile. It is a creeping ground cover that grows like a mat. It has small daisy like flowers with yellow centers and white petals. The leaves are feathery. It is a perennial.

Sunlight: Full sun to part shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 5-40 °C.

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Once your chamomile is established, it needs very little care.
- Like most herbs, chamomile grows best when it is not fussed over.
- Too much fertilizer will result in lots of weakly flavored foliage and few flowers.

Special Feature:

Herb gardens. Rock gardens and border fronts. Ground cover. Fill in between flag stones. Lawn substitute.

Use

Culinary use:

- If you pick up a half-dozen herb books to look up the chamomile herb, you are likely to find a bewilderment of names.
- There's Roman (or English) chamomile, a perennial, and German (or Hungarian) chamomile, an annual.
- The German species might be listed as *Matricaria chamomilla*, *Chamomilla recutita*, or *Matricaria recutita*.

Note:

No serious insect or disease problems. Watch for possible spread.
