Hadjod is botanically termed as *Cissus quadrangularis*. It is a perennial plant of the grape family. It belongs to the genus *Cissus* and family Vitaceae. It is probably native to India or Sri Lanka, but is also found in Africa, Arabia, and Southeast Asia.

Common name(s): Veld grape, devils backbone, adamant creeper, asthisamharaka, hadjod and pirandai.

Flower colours: Greenish

Bloom time: May-June

Max reachable height: 8 to 10 cm

Difficulty to grow: Easy to grow

Planting and care

Growing plants can be inexpensive, particularly when growing them from seed. Seeds of plants flowers should usually be sown directly into the sunny flower bed, as developing roots do not like to be disturbed.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: Well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 110 degrees C .

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

- Deadhead to prolong flowering.
- Maintain moderate soil moisture and fertilize lightly.
- plant will die with the first frost.
