Description Hibiscus moscheutos is a species of flowering plant in the family Malvaceae. It is a cold-hardy perennial wetland plant that can grow in large colonies.

Common name: Hibiscus moscheutos

Color: Pink, rose, red and white with red eyes

Bloom time: July to September

Height: 4.00 to 6.00 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Gather seeds once the flowers fade. Gardeners can pinch the seed head off and place it in a cool, dry location to dry the seeds; or, let the pods dry on the plant before breaking them open to collect the seeds. Store seeds in a cool, dry spot until you are ready to plant them.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium to wet

Temperature: 68-72¼ F

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Select a 5- to 6-inch stem.
- Cuttings should be taken from new growth that is about as thick as a pencil.
- Place the cutting directly into a glass or container of water after cutting.
-

Remove any of the cutting s lower leaves before placing it in a container filled with 1 part peat and 3 parts sand.

- The cutting should begin forming roots within five weeks.

Special Feature:

Moist borders. Specimens. Useful in low spots or wet areas in the landscape. Effective along streams or ponds. Temporary summer screen or hedge. Can be grown in large containers.
