Description Eryngium aquaticum is a species of flowering plant in the carrot family known by the common name rattlesnakemaster, marsh rattlesnake master, corn-snakeroot, bitter snakeroot, and marsh eryngo. This plant is native to eastern North America.

Common name: eryngo

Color: White

Bloom time: September to October

Height: 3.00 to 4.00 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Grow in medium to wet soils in full sun to part shade. Will grow in wet soils with shallow water, but will also prosper in garden loams given consistent moisture. Tall plants may sprawl, particularly if grown in overly fertile soils or in too much shade. May be grown from seed.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium to wet

Temperature: high temperature

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Eryngo (also sometimes called sea holly) grows to 4' tall.
- It features basal leaves that are linear to oblong-lanceolate and entire to remotely toothed.
- The upper leaves are sometimes spiny toothed to lacinate.
- Tiny white flowers (sometimes with a purplish tinge) bloom in summer in tight, rounded, flower heads.

Special Feature:

Water gardens, ponds, low spots. Borders.

Use

Ornamental use:

- The plant is used for ornamental purpose.

Note:

No serious insect or disease problems. Taller plants may need support.
