This indoor tree type plant grows over 15 metres tall in its natural habitat and up to 3 metres indoors, although they can be topped to prevent them growing taller. When these plants mature in age and size they make a great focal point within living rooms, hallways, offices or hotels.

Planting and care

Try misting the plant regularly to increase the ambient humidity.

Do not over water this plant, apply any organic fertilizer once in 2 months.

Special features: These leaves of this plant have a glossy appearance and grow up to 12 inches long and 5 inches or more wide.

Ornamental use: They are perfect if you can situate them in a floor-standing container.
