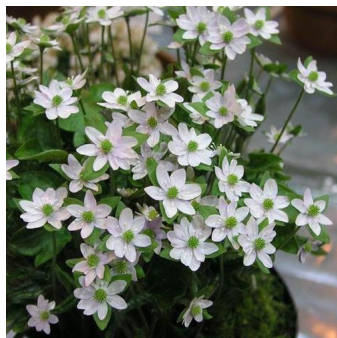


Hepatica acutiloba - Plant

Description

Description for Hepatica acutiloba

This herbaceous perennial plant. It consists of a tuft of basal leaves. Each leaf is palmately divided into 3 lobes; the lobes are oval-ovate and approximately the same size. The upper surface is more green during the summer, but become reddish brown during the winter. A mature plant will produce a tuft of flowers on long stalks during early to mid-spring.

Planting and care

The preference is dappled sunlight during the spring and light shade during the summer. The basal leaves should be left undisturbed during the winter. The soil should be well-drained, loamy, and can contain some rocky material, including pieces of limestone; a thin-layer of decaying leaves is also beneficial.

Caring for Hepatica acutiloba

- Once planted, additional hepatica plant care is rarely needed, especially if suitable hepatica growing conditions have been provided.
- You may divide the clumps of plants that multiply after the blooms have ceased to propagate them and add to another area in your garden.

Typical uses of Hepatica acutiloba

Ornamental use: The plant is used for an ornamental purpose. Its generally keep indoor in a living room and in terrace area.
