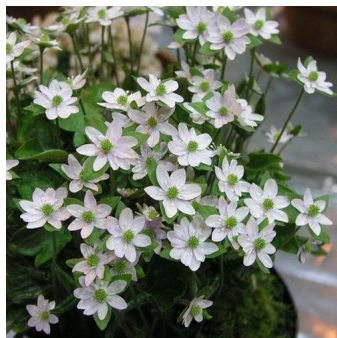


Hepatica acutiloba - Plant

Planting and care

Hepatica grows well in partial shade to full shade and is an excellent specimen plant under and around trees, or woodland settings. This plant thrives in well-drained soil, but also tolerates damp soil in low-lying areas. Few plants can tolerate heavy soils as liverleaf hepatica can.

Caring for Hepatica acutiloba

Once planted, additional hepatica plant care is rarely needed, especially if suitable hepatica growing conditions have been provided. You

may divide the clumps of plants that multiply after the blooms have ceased to propagate them and add to another area in your garden.
