Description for Hydrangea Macrophylla (Blue)

Plant height: 5 - 9 inches

Plant spread: 4 - 6 inches

With immense billowy blossoms, hydrangeas flaunt an old-fashioned charm that is hard to resist. Colors also beguile with clear blues, vibrant pinks, frosty whites, lavender, and rose sometimes all blooming on the same plant.

The colors of some *H. macrophylla* flowers are affected by the relative availability of aluminum ions in the soil. Acidic soils with a pH of less than 5.5 produce blue flowers; soils with a pH greater than 5.5 produce pink flowers. White flowers are not affected by pH.

Hydrangeas are well known for their large, colorful blossoms, and can be found growing in many areas of the world. There are many species and varieties of hydrangeas, which produce blossoms in a wide array of colors and shapes. They are relatively easy to grow, as long as you plant them in the right conditions as described below.

Common name(s): All Summer Beauty, Alpengluhen bigleaf hydrangea, Ayesha, Blue Billow, Blue Wave

Flower colours: Red, Pink, Blue, Purple, White

Bloom time: Summer, fall.

Max reachable height: 4 to 6 feet.

Difficulty to grow: Easy.

Planting and care

Plant in spring or fall. Dig a hole as deep as the root ball and 2 to 3 times as wide. Set the plant in the hole and fill it half full with soil. Water. After water is drained, fill the rest of the hole with soil. Water thoroughly. Space multiple hydrangeas about 3 to 10 feet apart.

Sunlight: Prefer full sun in the morning with some afternoon shade.

Soil: Acidic, Slightly Acidic to Neutral, Neutral, Neutral to Slightly Alkaline.

Water: Water daily for the first few days after planting. Once the plant is established then water when soil dries out.

Temperature: Cool to average 45-65F/7-18C.

Fertilizer: Fertilize once or twice in the summer.

Caring for Hydrangea Macrophylla

For the first year or two after planting and during any drought, be sure hydrangeas get plenty of water. Leaves will wilt if the soil is too dry. Be cautious about planting hydrangeas under or near trees, as the large roots may not leave enough water and nutrients for the hydrangeas. Keep an eye on hydrangeas in these positions, and transplant them to a new area if they are struggling to grow or produce flowers.
