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Description Cinnamon is a small evergreen tree 10–15 meters tall, native to Sri Lanka and South India. The bark is widely used as a spice due to its distinct odour. In India it is also known as "Daalchini". The leaves are ovate-oblong in shape, 7–18 cm long.

Common name: Tvak, Dalchini, Daruchini Karuva, Vazhana, Tamalapatra.

Color: greenish color

Bloom time: Spring to summer

Height: 10–15 meters

Planting & Care

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: medium

Temperature: 60 degrees

Fertilizer: fertilize weekly or biweekly, but only during active growth (late winter until fall).

Care:

- **FERTILIZING:** Moderate feeder; fertilize weekly or biweekly, but only during active growth (late winter until fall).
- **PRUNING:** Prune at any time for harvest or to prevent plants from becoming too tall or wide.

Special Feature:

Cinnamon has been known from remote antiquity, and it was so highly prized among ancient nations that it was regarded as a gift fit for monarchs and other great potentates. It was imported to Egypt from China as early as 2000 BC, and is mentioned in the Bible in Exodus. Use
