Description Prefers moist, organically rich, well-drained soils in full sun. Intolerant of shade. Difficult to transplant because of deep taproot.

Common name: butter nut

Color: yellow

Bloom time: May to June

Height: 40.00 to 60.00 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Juglans cinerea have bright green, compound leaves that generally grow about fifteen to twenty-five inches. These leaves themselves grow serrated leaflets. The butternut's foliage turns yellow when its dormant period begins in autumn.

Sunlight: Full Sun

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: medium

Temperature: 16° C (60° F)

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- As they have become more and more rare due to disease, it's fairly uncommon to see butternuts planted by enthusiasts.
- In the case that they are, the biggest key is to protect them from pests and canker, and make sure their soil drains well.

Special Feature:

Butternut is of interest to native plant enthusiasts and for those who wish to harvest the nuts. It is otherwise infrequently planted as an ornamental tree.
