- It is a small to medium-sized tree growing to 20 metres (66 ft) tall, with smooth, flaky bark.
- The leaves are deciduous, oval to elliptic, 8–15 cm (3.1–5.9 in) long and 3–5 cm (1.2–2.0 in) wide.

**Care:**

- Deadhead to prolong flowering.
- Maintain moderate soil moisture and fertilize lightly.
- plant will die with the first frost.

**Special Feature:**

The leaves of the banabá and other parts are used widely in the Philippines, Taiwan, and Japan as a tea preparation. Banabá herb is one of the 69 herbal plants promoted by the Philippine Department of Health (DOH).[3] In Vietnam the plant s young leaves are consumed as vegetables, and its old leaves and mature fruit are used in traditional medicine for reducing glucose in blood.
