Description Everybody loves lilies, and today s hybrids are a snap to grow, unlike some of the more difficult ones of the past. Today s favorites are no more work than growing a tulip or daffodil. First, take a look at the combination photo below.

Common name: Asiatic lily

Color: Red

Bloom time: June to July

Height: 2.00 to 3.00 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Each small-to-medium sized "Black Out" lily bulb should be planted deep enough to have 3 or 4 inches of soil over its top, while large bulbs need to be covered with about 5 or 6 inches of soil. You can plant each bulb in a single hole, or scoop out an area of soil and arrange your bulbs 12 to 18 inches apart before back-filling the area with soil.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: medium

Temprature: 55-63 degrees

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- There are many lily groups, but to keep it simple, we will consider only a few of the main types that are important to gardeners.
- Each lily we ship includes complete instructions for planting.
- So don t hesitate.
- You can easily bring the spectacular beauty of lily flowers to any summer meadow or garden.

Special Feature:

An excellent, showy flower that provides color and contrast to the summer perennial border. Also may be grown in pots or containers, but plants and flowers will be somewhat smaller.

Use

Ornamental use:

- The plant is used for ornamental purpose.

Note:

For the average gardener, Asiatic hybrid lilies are perhaps the easiest lilies to grow. Usually pest free, but potential diseases include: (1) lily mosaic virus (prompt control of aphids which vector the disease is highly recommended, since there is no cure once infection occurs); (2) bulb rot (particularly in wet, poorly drained soils); and (3) Botrytis. Plants may need staking if grown in too much shade (stems weaken) or in locations exposed to strong winds.
