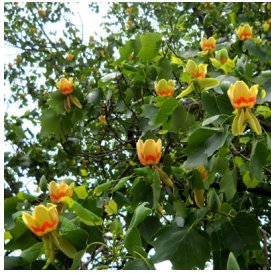

Caring for Liriodendron

- Caring for a tulip tree is relatively easy.
- Fertilize in early spring and watch for pests and disease.
- Stake young trees early on and train to one straight leader.

- Due to the rapid growth of this tree, pruning is essential.
- It poses a competitive challenge to other trees in the nearby area and the brittle branches pose a possible hazard to passersby..

Typical uses of Liriodendron

Special features: Very large shade or lawn tree for large landscapes. Generally not recommended as a street tree.

Ornamental use: The plant is used for ornamental purpose

Medicinal use: tonic and heart
