Description The tree can grow over 30 m (98 ft) tall, often buttressed at the base with a trunk up to 2 m (6 ft 7 in) in diameter. The bark of younger trees has an ash grey color with flaky peelings, while of old trees the bark is dark ash-grey with a red-brown blaze. It has simple, opposite, narrow, oblong to lanceolate, blue-grey to dark green leaves that are 7–15 cm (2.8–5.9 in) long and 1.5–3.5 cm (0.59–1.38 in) wide.

Common name: Sri Lankan ironwood, Indian rose chestnut,

Planting & Care

The deep planting encourages the developing stem to send out roots to help stabilize the plant and perhaps eliminate the need for staking. Also, deep planting keeps lily bulbs cool when temperatures soar.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 30-40 degree c

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Piles (Arsh) are vascular structures in the anal canal which gets swollen and inflamed and the patient feels difficult to defecate with continuous throbbing (pin pricking) pain along with bleeding stools, Nagkesar reduces the Swelling and Shrinks the Piles, Eradicating the Pain and Stops the Bleeding.
- Fresh flowers of this tree are used to treat Bleeding piles.

Care:

- Apply a high-potassium liquid fertilizer every 2 weeks from early spring until 6 weeks after flowering.
- Keep moist in winter.

Special Feature:

As the English name indicates, the wood of this tree is very heavy, hard and strong. The density is 940 to 1,195 kg/m³ (59 to 75 lb/ft³) at 15% moisture content. The colour is deep dark red. It is hard to saw and is mainly used for railroad ties and heavy structural timber.

Use

Medicinal use:

- The flowers, leaves, seeds and roots are used as herbal medicines in India, Malaysia, etc.
