Description Fruit is a globose receptacle bearing capsule, 5 x 3 mm, obovoid, truncate, hispid above; seeds many, flat, winged, bifid at the tip. Purple Neo-Cheesewood is found in Indo-Malaysia, Asia Pacific and Australia, and the Western Ghats- occasional in South and Central Sahyadris.

Common name: *Neonauclea purpurea*

Color: Purple

Bloom time: Late summer or early fall.

Height: 15 m

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

An accurate soil test will tell you where your pH currently stands. Acidic (sour) soil is counteracted by applying finely ground limestone, and alkaline (sweet) soil is treated with ground sulfur. If you order roses from a mail-order company, order early, in January or February (March at the latest). They are usually shipped in the spring as bare roots when plants are fully dormant, well before they have leafed out

Sunlight: Full Sun

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 27°C

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Start with pruning shears for smaller growth.
- Use loppers, which look like giant, long-handle shears, for growth that is more than half an inch thick.
- A small pruning saw is handy, as it cuts on both the push and the pull.

Special Feature:
