Description *Glechoma hederacea* is an aromatic, perennial, evergreen creeper of the mint family Lamiaceae. It is commonly known as ground-ivy, gill-over-the-ground, creeping charlie, alehoof, tunhoof, catsfoot, field balm, and run-away-robin.

Common name: Meehan s mint

Color: Lavender blue

Bloom time: May to June

Height: 0.25 to 0.50 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Native to Europe, Creeping Charlie (*Glechoma hederacea*) is a perennial member of the mint family. The variegated white and green leaves of the Creeping Charlie look like semicircles with scalloped edges.

Tiny purple flowers complement the leaves of the Creeping Charlie in the spring, adding to the allure of this low-growing ground cover. Creeping Charlie grows just as well indoors as it does outside, functioning well as a low-maintenance houseplant.

Sunlight: Part shade to full shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: -29° to -23°C

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Water the Creeping Charlie on a weekly basis, maintaining moist soil at all times.
- Depending on the conditions of your home, the Creeping Charlie houseplant may need watering more than twice a week, so check the moisture level of the soil regularly.
- If the soil feels moist when you press your finger down to 1 inch, don't add more water.
