### Description for Nerine Lily (Mix Colors)

They are bulbous perennials. They produce spherical umbels of lily-like flowers in shades from white through pink to crimson. The leaves are threadlike and strap-shaped. Each flower is usually with consisting of six narrow tepals.

### Planting and care

Peat moss, compost or ground bark can be good for planting. Plant in the spring. Plant with the neck of the bulb just exposed. Plant about 8 to 10 inches apart. You can replant in the spring/summer.

Full sun to partial sun	Sandy Soil, Loamy Soil, Well-drained soil	Medium	18 to 28 degrees C	Use any organic fertilizer.

### Caring for Nerine Lily

- Avoid waterlogged soil.
- Reduce watering in the winter.
- Remove damaged and diseased plant parts.
- Fertilize the plant in the growing stages.
- Provide generous water when the plants are actively growing.
