Description The strychnine tree (*Strychnos nux-vomica* L.) also known as nux vomica, poison nut, semen strychnos and quaker buttons, is a deciduous tree native to India, and southeast Asia.

Botanical Name: *Strychnos nuxvomica*

Sanskrit Name: Kupilu

English Name: Nux vomica

Common Names: Kuchla

Common name: Crowfig, Nux-voanica tree, Poision nut, Snake wood, Bailewa, Kajra, Kuchala

Color: Small greenish white flowers appear in terminal cymes.

Height: 10-12 m

Difficulty level: Easy

Planting & Care

Soil: Loam and clay soils rich in organic matter are ideal.

Water: Immediately after planting plants are given light irrigation. Irrigation should be given, if there is no rain.

Care:

- It is propagated by seeds.
- Seeds are sown in polythene bags during May - June.
- Before sowing the seeds, it is soaked in water so that there will be better germination.
- The seeds will germinate within 20 - 25 days.
- The seedling are planted at a distance of 6 x 6 m distance during July.
- The pits of the size of 0.5 x 0.5 x 0.5 m and filled with FYM # 5 kg and neem cake 500 g/ pit are dug previously during may - June.

Harvesting: The tree comes to flower after about three years of planting. Flowering starts in the month of August and fruits ripen during

October. Fruits starts falling on the ground when they mature. Fruits are harvested by plucking, when they start falling on the ground. Fruits are dried and seeds are taken out from the fruits. Before filling a gunny bags the seeds are dried and kept in dry and clean place and there after sold in the market.

Care:

- Weeding: Weeding should be done after two months of planting and whenever required.
- As the plants grow tall then no regular weeding is required.

Use

Medicinal use:

- It is used for digestive complaints such as indigestion, vomiting, diarrhoea, and constipation.
- It is given for over sensitivity and irritability.
-

Nuxvomica is also good for colds with a blocked nose, flu with fever, shivering coughs with larynx pain.

- It is used for irregular menstruation, frequent urination, morning sickness and labour pain.
- Kuchla fruit is useful in treatment of leucoderma, blood disorders, piles, jaundice, urinary discharge and ulcers.
