Planting and care

Petunias do best in full sun, but can handle partial shade, especially in hotter areas.

Most varieties prefer full sun	They need well-draining, slightly moist soil.	Water them regularly	The warm area and let them grow on in cooler temperatures	Fertilize your plants monthly to ensure good growth. Double-flowered cultivars like a biweekly dose of fertilizer.

Caring for Petunia Grandiflora Violet

Petunias grow best in full sun, although they will tolerate dappled shade, especially in hot conditions. They need well-draining, slightly moist soil. In soggy soils, they become leggy. Regular deadheading also improves their appearance. An early and midsummer application of high-phosphorus fertilizer improves both blooms and vigor.

Typical uses of Petunia Grandiflora Violet

Special features: Attracts Birds, Fragrance, Good for Containers, Low Maintenance

Ornamental use: It is generally kept indoor and in terrace area
