Description Sourwood or sorrel tree, *Oxydendrum arboreum*, /??ks??d?ndr?m ??r?b??ri?m/ is the sole species in the genus *Oxydendrum*, in the family Ericaceae.

Common name: sourwood

Color: creamy yellow

Bloom time: June to July

Height: 20.00 to 50.00 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Start chaste tree seeds in spring approximately four weeks before the last frost. Soak the seeds in a bowl of water for 24 hours to determine which are viable. Start the seeds that sink to the bottom and discard those that float to the surface.

Sunlight: Full sun to part shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 45 degree

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Sow two chaste tree seeds in each pot.
- Press the seeds onto the surface of the moistened compost mixture.
- Cover them with a 1/4-inch-thick layer of compost.
- Mist the compost liberally to settle it.

Special Feature:

Beautiful small specimen flowering tree with multi-season interest for lawns, patios, shade gardens or open woodland areas.

Use

Ornamental use:

- The plant is used for ornamental purpose.
- Its generally kep indoor in living room and in terrac area.

No serious insect or disease problems. Leaf spot and twig blight infrequently occur.
