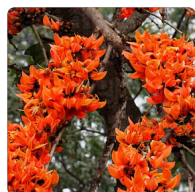

Description for Palash, Butea

Butea monosperma is a species of Butea native to tropical and sub-tropical parts of the Indian Subcontinent and Southeast Asia, ranging across India, Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, Thailand.

Planting and care

After a good rain, find a spot that is the first to dry out. Water trapped beneath the scales may rot the bulb, so a well-drained site is essential.

Also, select a site that gets full sun.

For dependable blooms, lilies need six to eight hours of direct sunlight a day.

Sunlight	Soil	Water	Temperature	Fertilizer
Full sun to part shade	well-drained soil	Medium	30Å° C	Apply any organic fertilizer

Caring for Palash

- The mulch should feel moist but not wet.
- Apply a high-potassium liquid fertilizer every 2 weeks from early spring until 6 weeks after flowering.
- Keep moist in winter.

- Apply a thin layer of compost each spring, followed by a 2-inch layer of mulch.
- Stake tall lilies. Lilies do not rebloom, but you can remove the faded flowers so that the plants seeds.

Typical uses of Palash

Special features: Best planted as a specimen in a mixed grove of trees that will hide its awkward habit but give its flowers full visibility.

Ornamental use: The plant is used for ornamental purpose. Its kept outdoor.
