Description for Pandanus Pygmaeus

Fragrant Screw Pine is a small branched tree or shrub with fragrant flowers, found wild in southern India, Burma and the Andamans. It is a small, slender, branching tree with a flexuous trunk supported by brace roots.

Planting and care

The plant requires at least 4 hours of direct sunlight everyday. Normal room temperatures are suitable for the plant. Soil: Use a soil based potting mixture. Humidity: The plant tolerates low humidity.

Caring for Pandanus Pygmaeus

Water plentifully during the growing season, but do not allow the plant to stand in water. Allow the soil to dry slightly between waterings.

Typical uses of Pandanus Pygmaeus

Special features: Flowers have a sweet, perfumed odor that has a pleasant quality similar to rose flowers, but kewra is more fruity.

Culinary use: Leaves

Ornamental use: The plant is used for ornamental purpose.
