application of a balanced, general-purpose fertilizer with similar proportions of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium.

Caring for Passiflora Sherry

- Water red passionflower vines deeply once or twice a week, saturating the soil to the root level.
- Prune dead or diseased vines back to the main vine in the spring before new growth resumes. Trim to maintain overall shape and size by removing overgrown vines.

Typical uses of Passiflora Sherry

Special features:

Ornamental use: The plant is used for ornamental purpose. Its generally kept indoor in living room and in terrace area.

Medicinal use:

Passionflower herb is used in alternative medicine for anxiety, insomnia, nervous disorders and seizures. Note: The following information is general guidelines. Be sure to ask your healthcare provider for guidelines.
