Description Pelargonium graveolens is an uncommon Pelargonium species native to the Cape Provinces and the Northern Provinces of South Africa, Zimbabwe and Mozambique. It is in the subgenus Pelargonium along with Pelargonium crispum and Pelargonium tomentosum.

Common name: scented-leaved geranium

Color: Pink to white

Bloom time: Seasonal bloomer

Height: 1.00 to 3.00 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Repot in spring. Geraniums bloom best if slightly pot-bound. Move your plant to a pot 1 size larger or keep it in the same pot and just give it fresh soil.

Pinch your plant. Pinch off stems regularly to encourage branching and to maintain an attractive shape. Also, remove spent flowers to keep your plant looking neat and to promote more blooms.

Sunlight: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 55-60°F

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Water: Keep soil evenly moist, not soggy.
- Allow surface of soil to dry between waterings.
- Cut back on watering in winter, but don't allow the roots to dry out completely.

Special Feature:

Foliage and flowers are not as ornamental as other geranium groups such as zonal geraniums or ivy leaved geraniums.

Use
