Planting and care

Sunlight	Soil	Water	Temperature	Fertilizer
Prefer dappled light (an east or west facing windowsill behind a net curtain is ideal).	They should be potted in a more typical houseplant mix that holds some moisture but still drains well.	Do not let the soil dry out. Water Phalaenopsis regularly throughout the growing season. Reduce watering slightly during the winter.	Night temperatures in the range of 16-19 degrees C (61-66 degrees F) and day temperatures between 19-30 degrees C (66-86 degrees F)	Give a quarter strength fertiliser once a month.

Caring for Phalaenopsis White

Too much bright light can burn the leaves and turn the plants yellowish while too little will result in plants with soft leaves that don't flower. Repot after flowering. Don't over pot; wash the old compost from the roots before working the new compost gently and firmly around the roots.
