Description Phoenix dactylifera, commonly known as date or date palm, is a flowering plant species in the palm family, Arecaceae, cultivated for its edible sweet fruit.

**Common name:** Adansonia digitata

**Color:** red

**Bloom time:** June-October.

**Height:** 6-14 cm

**Difficulty level:** 6-14 cm

**Planting & Care**

Each delicious Medjool date has a seed inside that can easily be grown into a tree. Save some of the seeds by removing them from the center of the dates. Place your date seeds in a small dish covered with cool water. Soak them for one week, changing the water at least once a day to keep mold from forming.

**Sunlight:** Full Sun

**Soil:** well-drained soil

**Water:** Medium

**Temperature:** 95 degrees

**Fertilizer:** Apply any organic fertilizer

**Care:**

- Water the tree every once every two weeks in the summer and once a month in the winter.
- That date palm usually stretches its roots deep into the ground to access subterranean water sources, so regular deep waterings are required for optimal health.
- Spraying the tree with the garden hose once in a while isn't enough.

**Care:**

- You can also use a palm tree fertilizer high in potassium.
- Watch for pests and disease and deal with them quickly as they arise.
- Once trees are established, you will rarely need to water them.
- Date palms prefer dry soil and excess moisture can inhibit growth.

**Special Feature:**

Prune the suckers around the bottom of the tree as needed -- at least once a year to prevent the formation of multiple trunks. Additional pruning of date palms is unnecessary.
