Description *Pithecellobium dulce* growing tree of the genus *Pithecellobium* also known as Sweet Inga or Monkeypod, *Pithecellobium dulce* perennial evergreen to semi-deciduous plant also used as ornamental plant, can grow in tropic, mediterranean, subtropical climate, fixing nitrogen

Flower fragrant the color white the flowers have dozen of stamina

Fruit grow in pods, the pod color is pink looks like scorpions tail, fruit pulp is white and hairy until 4-6 fruits in pod, in some cultivars peel easy, the seeds also edible

**Height:** 7-15 m

**Sunlight:** Full sun

**Soil:** Grows on poor soils in dry climates and along coastlines, including areas where roots are in brackish or salt water.

**Harvesting:** Cut as needed for fuel, the tree has a fast rate of growth, coppices vigorously and can withstand "any amount of pruning, lopping, or browsing by animals."
