Description Prosopis juliflora is a shrub or small tree in the family Fabaceae, a kind of mesquite. It is native to Mexico, South America and the Caribbean. It has become established as an invasive weed in Africa, Asia, Australia and elsewhere.

- The advent of Prosopis juliflora in the early 1970s is a classic example of this condition.

- It was introduced in several countries as an attempt to limit the risk of deforestation and shortage of fuelwood.
- Interestingly with time, it turned out to be a noxious invasive weed posing a major threat to the environment.

**Care:**

- It is important to understand that the substitution of natural vegetation with foreign ones can prove fatal to the existing bio diversity of the forest.
- The invasion of Prosopis today can be compared to the loss of forest area and disappearance of animals in the sanctuary in the late 40s

**Special Feature:**

flour products made from the pods are still popular, although only sporadically prepared, mostly by Amerindians. Pods are made into gruels, sometimes fermented to make a mesquite wine.
