Planting & Care

Black Cherry is a plant in the Prunus genus with a scientific name of Prunus serotina var. eximia. The botanical name epithet for Black Cherry (serotina) means produced late in the season. It grows mainly as a Deciduous, which is as a plant that tends to shed its leaves annually. Normally grows with a tree habit.

Sunlight: Full sun to part shade

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 34° to 43° F

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Easily grown in average, medium, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade.
- Best in moist, fertile loams in full sun.
- Young trees develop a long tap root which makes transplanting difficult.
