Description The plant has white to greenish flowers in umbrella-like umbels. One umbel may have as many as 40 branches and be up to 8 inches (20 cm) across. The stalks can be eaten like celery and the flavor is similar.

Common name: Angelica atropurpurea

Color: White to greenish-white.

Bloom time: June to September

Height: 6 feet (180 cm) tall.

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Growing plants can be inexpensive, particularly when growing them from seed. Seeds of plants flowers should usually be sown directly into the sunny flower bed, as developing roots do not like to be disturbed.

Sunlight: Full Sun

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Medium

Temperature: 38 F.

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Place plants in full sun in average, well-drained soil.
- Drainage is important; don't place where roots will sit in water.
- Leaves develop best flavor in full sun.
