Description Robinia pseudoacacia, commonly known in its native territory as black locust, is a medium-sized deciduous tree native to the southeastern United States, but it has been widely planted and naturalized

Common name: black locust

Planting & Care

Plants prefer a near-neutral pH range of 5.5–7.0. A pH of 6.5 is just about right for most home gardens (slightly acidic to neutral). An accurate soil test will tell you where your pH currently stands. Acidic (sour) soil is counteracted by applying finely ground limestone, and alkaline (sweet) soil is treated with ground sulfur.

Sunlight: Full sun

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: Dry to medium

Temperature: 2° to 13° C

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Plants do not thrive in Zones 9 to 10 without a period of refrigeration; they need a cold, dormant period.
- Select a site with soil that drains well.
- How can you tell? After a good rain, find a spot that is the first to dry out.
- Water trapped beneath the scales may rot the bulb, so a well-drained site is essential.

Care:

- Diligently water your plants.
- Soak the entire root zone at least twice a week in dry summer weather.
- Avoid frequent shallow sprinklings, which won't reach the deeper roots and may encourage fungus.
- Plants do best with 90 inches of rain per year, so unless you live in a rain forest, water regularly.

Special Feature:

This tree is not generally recommended for prime landscape areas because of its suckering habit and its susceptibility to borers. It is considered to be a good selection for difficult areas where other trees will not grow well.

Use

Medicinal use:

- In traditional medicine of India, different parts of R.
- pseudoacacia are used as laxative, antispasmodic, and diuretic.
- In Romania the flowers are sometimes used to produce a sweet and perfumed jam.
