Thunbergia alata, or Black-eyed Susan vine, is a frequent sight in hanging baskets ... Flowers are most commonly found in orange, pale yellow or white

Common name: black-eyed Susan

Color: Orange-yellow

Bloom time: Seasonal bloomer

Height: 3.00 to 8.00 feet

Difficulty level: easy to grow

Planting & Care

Thunbergia alata, or black-eyed Susan vine, is a common houseplant. This is probably because it is easy to propagate from stem cuttings and, therefore, easy for owners to pass along a piece of the plant.

Sunlight: Full Sun

Soil: well-drained soil

Water: medium

Temperature: 70°-75°

Fertilizer: Apply any organic fertilizer

Care:

- Growing a black-eyed Susan vine from cuttings is easier.
- Overwinter the plant by cutting several inches from a terminal end of a healthy plant.
- Remove the bottom leaves and place in a glass of water to root.
- Change the water every couple of days.
- Once you have thick roots, plant the start in potting soil in a pot with good drainage

Special Feature:

Trellises, arbors, fences or other structures around the home. Also effective in hanging baskets where the vine can twist around the basket supports or in patio containers with a small trellis or obelisk buried in the container.
