Planting and care

Several types of ivy are also suitable for growing as a house plant, and can be used as a hanging plant, topiaries, or espaliered on a small trellis. As a house plant, Ivy grows best where they get four or more hours a day of direct sunlight, but it will grow fairly well in bright indirect light.

Sunlight	Soil	Water	Temperature	Fertilizer
Part shade to full shade	Sandy soil	Keep soil moist throughout the growing season	20 to 30 degrees C	Apply any organic fertilizer

Caring for Variegated English Ivy

- Variegated ivy leaves will typically have green and white or yellow markings.
- The white and yellow areas on the variegated ivy leaves lack chlorophyll.
- Chlorophyll serves many purposes, the main ones being producing food for the variegated ivy plant and protecting the plant from the

rays of the sun.
