Description for Ficus Repens, Wagh Nakhi, Creeping Fig

A large growing woody, ivy like, evergreen climber. Leaves are rough deep green 2 to 3 cm long. The shoots grow close to the wall by clasping the surface with nodal roots. Effectively covers bare walls with small green leaves. The fruit is a large fig shaped and sized fruit.

Planting and care

proper indoor creeping fig care, the soil should be kept moist but not overly wet. It is best to check the top of the soil before watering. If the top of the soil is dry, it needs to be watered.

Medicinal use: In China, leaves used for painful and swollen piles. Leaves also used for dysentery, hematuria and locally to carbuncles. Whole plant used for spermatorrhea and as a galactagogue. Also used for impotence, menstrual disorders, dysuria, dyschezia, rheumatism, lumbago, boils and impetigo.
